





With the help of a trusted adult, follow the instructions to make your own Lion bag.




You will need a coat hanger, felt, scissors, a hot-glue gun, and hot glue sticks.

Drape the felt over the hanger. Glue the felt together below the hanger to keep it from sliding off.




Fold the felt up on both sides. Glue the edges to form pockets. On one side, add a strip of glue in the middle to form two pockets.
