


Scout handshake







First, color the puzzle. Cut out the square, not the individual pieces. Glue the square on to cardboard.









Disappearing Knot




Hold both ends of your 3-foot rope in your left hand. Put your right hand under and through the bend.




Bring your right hand holding the two rope parts back through the bend to make the two loops as shown here.



Put the ends in your left hand through both loops. Let go with the left and take hold of one end.



Take the other end in your right hand and pull the ends apart. When a small knot forms, blow on it and pull the rope straight.


